

# Lesson 34

## Principal Parts of Verbs

- Three of the principal parts of a verb are the **present**, the **past**, and the **past participle**. The past participle is the form of the verb that is used after *have*.
- In regular verbs, the past and past participle forms are identical. In irregular verbs, however, these forms may differ.

EXAMPLES:	<b>present</b>	<b>past</b>	<b>past participle</b>
Regular	(I) love	(I) loved	I (have) loved
Irregular	(I) break	(I) broke	I (have) broken

- Dictionaries list irregular forms of verbs under the main entry for the verb. If no forms are listed, the verb is regular.
